According to the most recent Census data, 15.5% of people in Kearney live in poverty. This is the equivalent of a family of four living on \$30,000 or less per year. All of these individuals would exceed the seating capacity at Cope Stadium at Foster Field. Over 17% of children under 18 years old live in poverty, which is over 1000 children.
